

NEW INVENTIONS SCULPTURE WORKSHOP WITH NEIL ELLIOTT

Participants are asked to source materials prior to the commencement of the workshop. You are required to bring along a collection of items for your own use. Materials can be sourced from your own property or any unwanted materials you can find. Timber and light weight metals are preferred.

SUGGESTIONS OF APPROPRIATE ITEMS:

Old wooden furniture legs, scrap timber pieces (shaped), old tools, old car parts (small), wire, rusty nails, old paint brushes, old cutlery, old washer, pressed tin, cogs, tin signs, cow bells, kitchen tools, horse shoes, bale hooks, sheep shears, plough blades, old gauges, screens, springs, pram wheels, car lights, copper/aluminium sheet, copper pipes etc.

TOOLS TO BRING:

Please bring the follow tools (if possible); cordless drill, hammer, screwdrivers, saw, sandpaper, nails and screws, wood glue, strong glues, rivets and rivet gun, pliers, sander and jigsaw.

Please bring safety glasses, gloves, hearing protection and please wear enclosed shoes.

Using up-cycled materials and found objects, artist and sculptor Neil Elliott will guide you through basic woodworking and metal working techniques to create your own unique sculpture. Working collectively and individually you will learn elements of sculpting whilst employing objects and tools brought from home to develop your technical skills.
